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## ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

This Sunday, we celebrate the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is a somewhat difficult term, as it can imply a sort of boredom or monotony. However, in its liturgical usage, it simply means that rather than celebrate a particular season (i.e., Christmas or Lent), we celebrate the “ordinary” miracles and events of the life of Christ—which are often, in fact, extraordinary! We use Gregorian chant Mass XI “Orbis Factor” for the Mass ordinary this weekend. One of the older settings in the Kyrie, parts of it are a millennium old! It is prescribed by the Church for Ordinary Time. We are reminded that the Church requests that all the faithful be familiar with these “ordinary” parts of the Mass in both the vernacular AND Latin: this is particularly important as our country becomes more diverse. The Latin Rite of the Catholic Church is the largest and most cosmopolitan of all the rites of the Church, so Latin gives us a liturgical “lingua franca” so that we can more easily see ourselves (in spite of cultural differences and the like) as brothers and sisters in Christ, worshipping the Lord together. The ordinary, and its somewhat more melancholy feel, is balanced by today’s hymnody, which is all in a variety of major keys and national styles (we have two German, one American, and one English tune). Today’s choral music also is taken from diverse sources. We also benefit today from the recent blossoming of work in the area of vernacular chant. These compositions are written in the same Gregorian modes that Latin chant utilizes, but are more immediately accessible due to their use of the vernacular. Also, like the Gregorian originals, they maintain the same Scriptural texts. This is of great benefit to the Sacred Liturgy, both in terms of integrity and comprehension. Today’s communion antiphon preserves a frequent function of the antiphon in the Latin originals: that is, it recalls the text of the Gospel account of the day’s Mass. This use reminds us that the Jesus Christ whom we hear speaking and is present in the proclamation of Sacred Scripture in the Liturgy of the Word is the same Jesus Christ whom we receive in Holy Communion—the Word Incarnate.
