

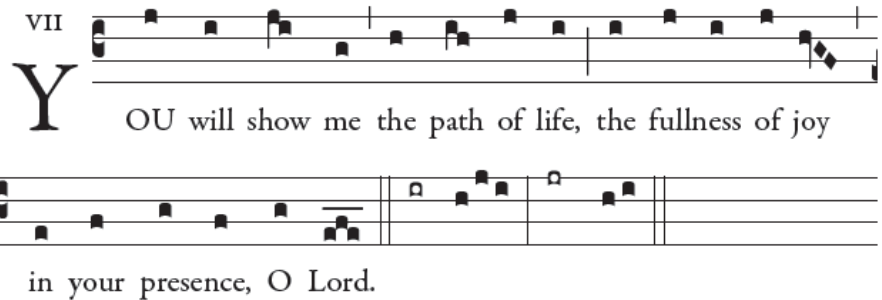


HOLY COMMUNION

Please join in singing the refrain below after the cantor introduction and between verses of Psalm 16.



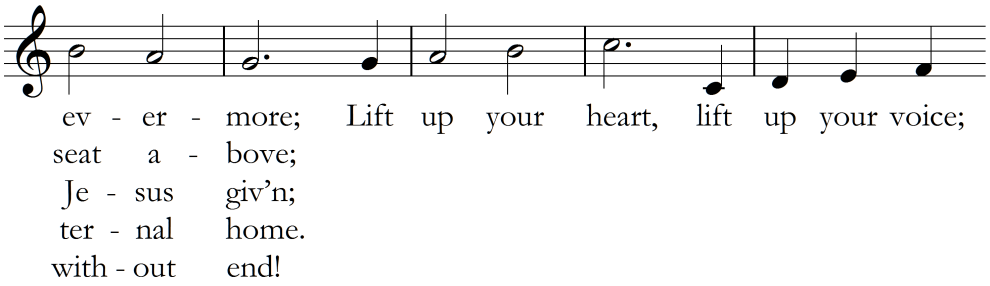
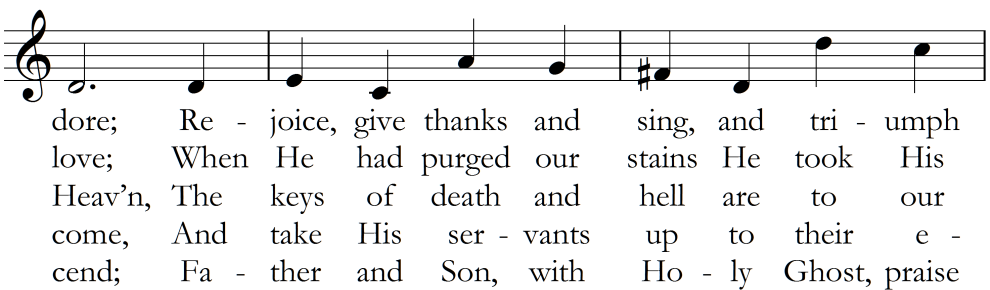
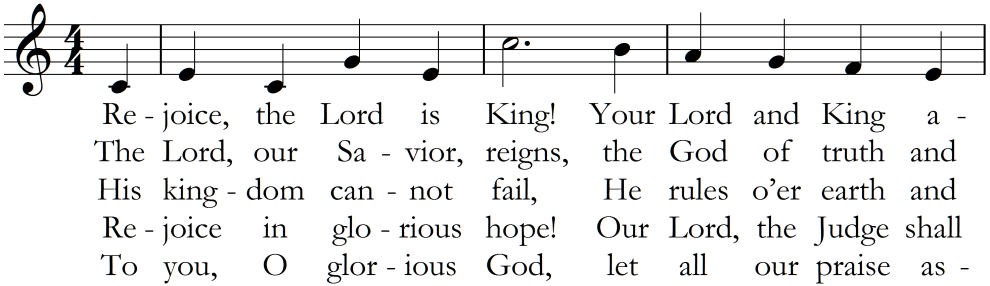
