Welcome to the Cathedral's celebration of Second Vespers for the Sundays in Advent. This order will be your guide for the liturgy. Please note the symbols for cantor or celebrant (V., Can., or Celebrant) and assembly (R. or All) and pray accordingly. Evening Prayer begins with the following verse:




After the hymn follows the psalmody of the office. Each psalm has an associated antiphon. The antiphon will be introduced, then the schola will chant the incipit of the antiphon (the portion up to the asterisk, i.e., “The Lord will come to claim...”). Please join in the remainder of the antiphon. After the psalm, all sing the antiphon in its entirety. The psalm verses are sung alternating by verse between cantor and assembly. The psalm tone is found at the end of the antiphon below.
