Welcome to the Cathedral's celebration of Second Vespers for the Sundays in Advent. This order will be your guide for the liturgy. Please note the symbols for cantor or celebrant (V̇., Can., or Celebrant) and assembly (Ṙ. or All) and pray accordingly. Evening Prayer begins with the following verse:

After the hymn follows the psalmody of the office. Each psalm has an associated antiphon. The antiphon will be introduced, then the cantor will chant the incipit of the antiphon (the portion up to the asterisk, i.e., “The Lord will come...”) Please sing the remainder of the antiphon. After the psalm, all sing the antiphon in its entirety.

The psalm verses are sung alternating by verse between cantor and assembly. The psalm tone is found at the end of the antiphon below.

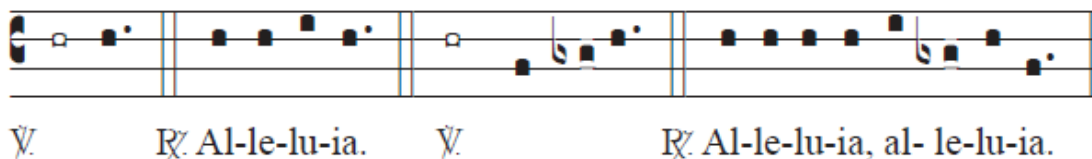
The third antiphon is followed by a canticle. The antiphon is sung as in the preceding psalms (cantor intones to the asterisk, all join thereafter.) Then, the cantor chants the passages from the book of Revelation, while the assembly responds with the single or double Alleluia as indicated.

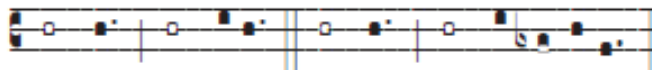

(The antiphon [on the facing page] is then repeated by all.)


