Responsum accepit Simeon a Spiritu Sancto, non visurem se mortem, nisi videret Christum Domini.


Simeon received a revelation from the Holy Spirit, that he would not see death until he had seen the Lord's Messiah.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

OR "CANDLEMAS"

FEBRUARY 2, 2019

Welcome to the Cathedral. The order of Mass is in the first section of Sunday's Word, found in the pew rack, starting on page 3. The music for the initial rites of the Mass is provided by the Cathedral Childrens' Schola Cantorum, open to any interested child grades 3-8. THE SOLEMN ENTRANCE

The faithful gather (with their candles) at the rear of the church by the baptismal font. The celebrant and servers process to the font, where the lighting of candles commences immediately, while the following antiphon is sung.

ANTIPHON *Ecce Dominus noster*

ISAIAH 35:4,5

Ecce Dominus noster cum virtute veniet, ut illuminet oculos servorum suorum, alleluia.

Behold, our Lord will come with power, to enlighten the eyes of his servants, alleluia.

The celebrant then greets and addresses the faithful. The blessing of candles proceeds directly thereafter. After sprinkling with holy water and loading the thurible, the procession to the altar begins with the following words:

V. Let us go in peace to meet the Lord.

R. In the name of Christ. Amen.

The following antiphon, with verses from the Canticle of Simeon or Nunc Dimittis, is sung during the procession.

ANTIPHON *Lumen ad revelationem*

LUKE 2:29-32

Lumen ad revelationem gentium, et gloriam plebis tuae Israel.

A light for revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of your people Israel.

Lord, now let your servant depart in peace, in accordance with your word. For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all peoples.

When the celebrant reaches the chair, he intones the Gloria in excelsis (see following page). After the singing of the Gloria, he says the collect as usual and Mass proceeds.
