\*A note about the Gradual: this gradual, one of the most famous in the repertoire, was traditionally the Holy Thursday gradual. However, after the 1969 liturgical changes, it was assigned to Palm Sunday and Good Friday, not as a chant between first and second readings, as is usually the case, but in the place of the "Verse before the Gospel". This unique situation helps prepare us for the proclamation of the Passion of St. Luke.
