

**A note about the Gradual: while the usual practice at St. Paul is to sing the Responsorial Psalm, occasionally it is appropriate to utilize the Church's first option for the chant between readings: the Gradual. The Gradual is designed as a meditation upon the readings of the day. A particularly positive trait of the Gradual during the Easter season is that it is always an alleluia refrain, reminding us more insistently that we remain in the season of profound joy and rejoicing!*






