–In late January, the Cathedral signed a contract with the Noack Organ
Company for their Opus 164, which will be installed in Summer 2021.
Our new pipe organ will be named the Anna Catharine Grace Memo-
rial Pipe Organ in honor of the instrument’s major donor. While her
generous gift made initiation of the project possible, a large sum must
still be raised for the total project cost. Please visit the Cathedral web-

mation. After the June visit of Fr. Jerabek and our organists to our
“little sister” Noack instrument in Washington, DC (a design of simi-
lar size and composition to ours), we are confident that this will be a
truly worthy and excellent instrument, totally unique in our city and

ject to completion.
