The Cathedral is hosting a Children's Schola Camp (half-days from August 5-9 at the Cathedral, for interested singers in grades 3-8) and Southeastern Sacred Music (August 9-10), a regional Catholic sacred music conference. In late January, the Cathedral signed a contract with the Noack Organ Company for their Opus 164, which will be installed in Summer 2021. 
