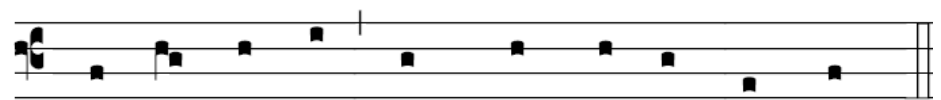


# HOLY COMMUNION
