

MUSIC REMINDERS

- *We have started the St. Cecilia Choir with the encouragement of Bishop Raica.* The St. Cecilia Choir is a new choral group at the Cathedral which helps lead singing at the 8:30am Mass, usually celebrated by our diocesan Bishop, the Most Reverend Steven J. Raica. It provides a quality choral experience with rehearsal and repertoire demands less than that of Cathedral Choir. All the same, it strives to model the high standard directed by the Second Vatican Council (cf., *Sacrosanctum concilium*, 114). Repertoire will initially focus on harmonized hymns and psalmody, with a possibility for some more elaborate choral music in the more festive times of the year. Please contact the Director of Music as soon as possible if interested. **Rehearsal is Wednesday at 5:15pm: come join us any time!**
- *Cathedral Childrens' Schola Cantorum has resumed!* Open to all children from GR 3-8, this ensemble teaches basic music literacy (in modern and chant notation), healthy singing, and principles of the sung liturgy. Interested parents should contact the Director of Music to register their child. A nominal fee is charged for participation, capped at two children per family. New members are still happily accepted.
- If you enjoy singing and can read music, ***please consider joining Cathedral Choir***, which leads singing at the 11:00am Mass and holy days throughout the year. Rehearsal resumed on September 1, but new members are still accepted; there is a particular need for ladies'/treble voices, although all good voices are welcome!
