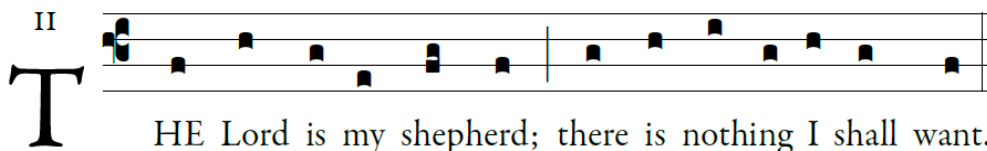
HOLY COMMUNION
