

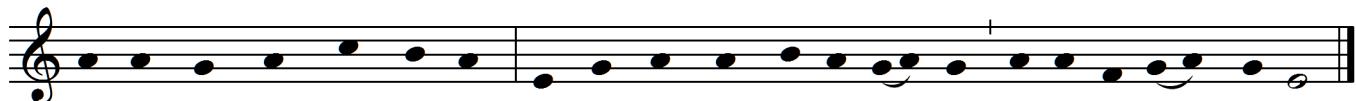

## HOLY COMMUNION


We invite all Catholics who are properly disposed (i.e., in the state of grace and having fasted for one hour before communion) to come forward in the usual way to receive Holy Communion.

## ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

We are celebrating the halfway point of the Easter season this Sunday, with Pentecost Sunday celebrated this year on Memorial Day weekend. In the meantime, we walk with Our Lord through the Gospel's accounts of His ministry, and this Sunday hear the various passages from Sacred Scripture that name Him as "Pastor Bonus" or "Good Shepherd". This famous imagery encourages us to look at Psalm 23, which provides the responsorial psalm as well as the communion antiphon and other texts of the Mass. As is usually the case here, we use a Gregorian Mass ordinary where the *Kyrie* is in Greek, with the other parts of the Mass in Latin. The setting is Mass I, which the Church suggests for Eastertide. In so doing, we have the benefit of knowing the many Catholics all over the world will sing these same words to these same melodies this weekend, unifying us as one voice as we praise the Risen Lord. (NB: if you are ever looking to learn these chants, just search for "Mass I" online, or talk to the Director of Music!) The 11am postcommunion motet is the outgrowth of a popular movement of renewal of the liturgy: the Caecilian movement in German-speaking countries in the 19th Century encouraged a recovery amongst Catholics of quality sacred music and especially Gregorian chant. The polyphony (that is, music in multiple vocal parts) written often took the form of earlier masters of the Roman school (Palestrina et al). Haller's motet is one such work: it is scored for five voices, three of men, two of ladies (perfect for our Cathedral Choir!) We hear a little bit of the influence of di Lasso, whose setting of the same text we often sing here, as well. We hope this music enriches your celebration of Good Shepherd Sunday!
