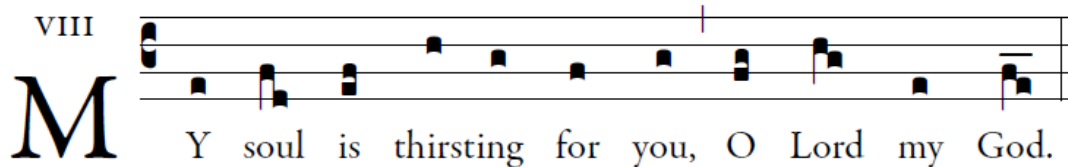

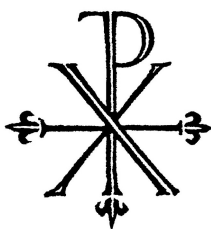



HOLY COMMUNION

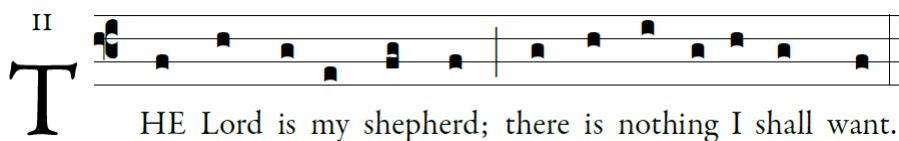
We invite all Catholics who are properly disposed (i.e., in the state of grace and having fasted for one hour before communion) to come forward in the usual way to receive Holy Communion.

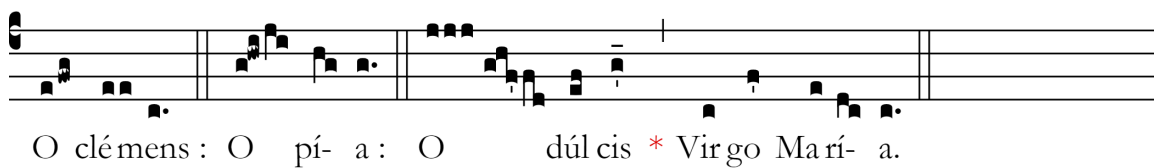

MUSIC REMINDERS

–THANK YOU to those who attended last weekend’s BYRD ENSEMBLE concert. Attendees enjoyed over an hour of some of the most glorious sacred polyphony written—some from a long time ago, some literally from 2023! Please mark your calendars NOW for our next event, an organ recital by Bruce Ludwick, Jr., our Director of Music and Organist, on SUNDAY, DECEMBER 4, at 4:00pm. Mr. Ludwick will present a varied program including works by Buxtehude, Bach, and Louis Vierne’s Second Symphony for Organ. As M. Lefebvre remarked during his visit (after auditioning some of the Anna Catharine Grace Memorial Pipe Organ), “[It’s] just like Notre-Dame!” Vierne was, for many years, organiste titulaire of Notre-Dame, breathing his last in the middle of a recital at the Cathedral in 1937. The Second Symphony is cyclical (all based on one musical idea) and will show the many unique colors of the organ, including a number of stops that are direct copies of those at Notre-Dame-de-Paris.
