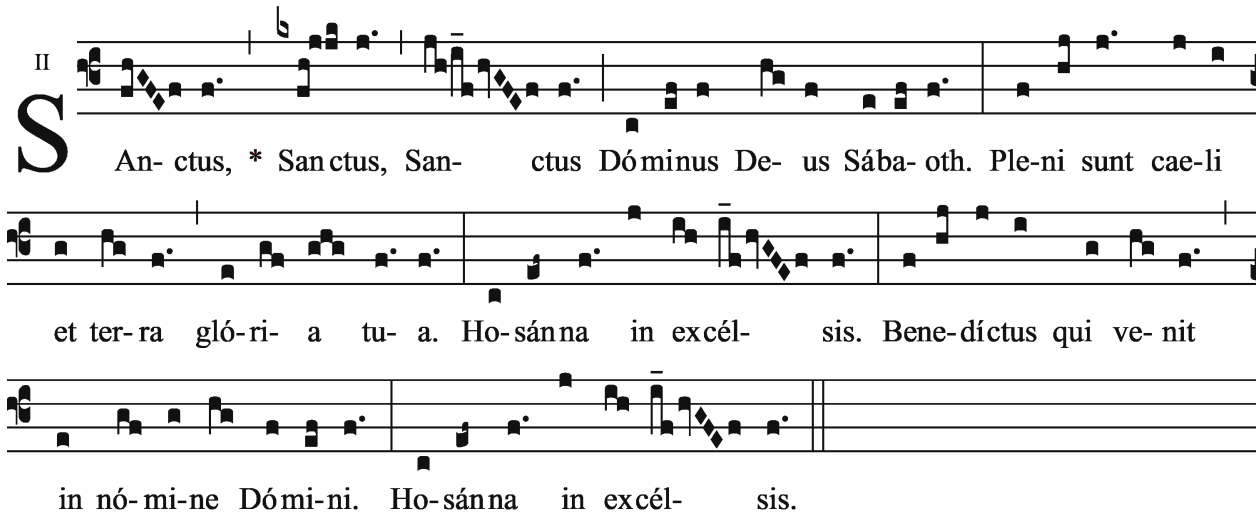

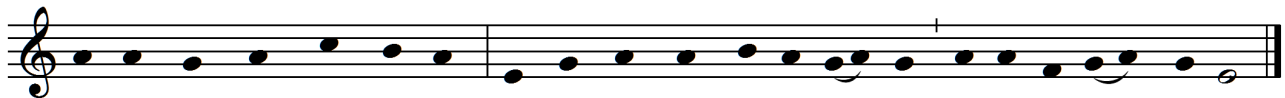

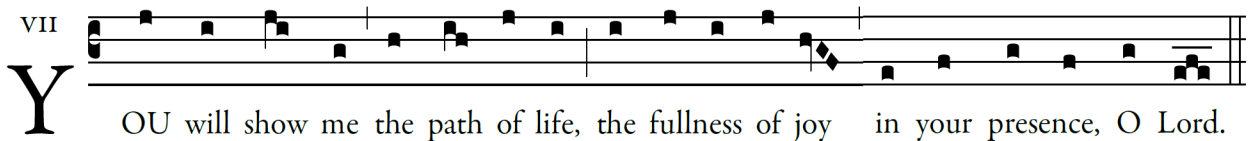
HOLY COMMUNION
