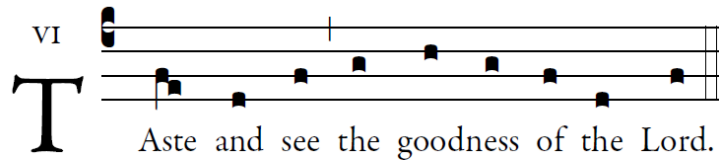
HOLY COMMUNION

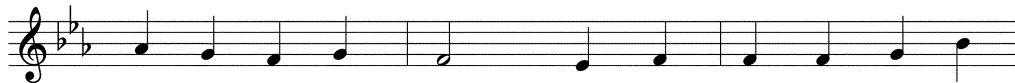
