Anointing of the Sick

For those who have reached the use of reason and are in danger of death from sickness or old age. Anointing is ordinarily preceded by Confession. Contact a priest. In emergencies, call anytime and select the emergency option.

Baptism

The Church instructs parents to seek baptism for their child within the first few weeks after birth. First-time parents ordinarily must attend a pre-baptismal class. Contact the office, preferably during the pregnancy, to make the arrangements. Godparents must meet Church requirements.

Holy Matrimony

Contact the Wedding Coordinator at least six months in advance. Subject to the Cathedral's wedding guidelines (on web site) and Diocesan policies.

Funerals and Columbarium

Contact the office prior to making arrangements with the funeral home. To learn more about the columbarium including costs, call the office.

September Relics

September's frame of relics include one of St. Moses, the Lawgiver (yes, the great patriarch of the Old Testament) – however, the Bible is clear on the fact that God "hid" Moses' body (Deuteronomy 34:6), and people in the 18th century, when our relic collection was assembled, knew that too. What this "relic" likely is, then, is a chip of rock from Mount Sinai, where Moses received the law. Among the many other interesting relics for this month, there is also a tiny piece of the True Cross! Some of the largest portions of the cross are found at the Basilica of "The Holy Cross in Jerusalem", which is located in Rome not far from the Basilica of St. John Lateran – the Holy Father's cathedral church. When St. Helena, mother of the Emperor Constantine, located the relics of the Passion, she had them brought to Rome and that church built to house them. If you ever go to Rome, be sure to visit it, looking for the passageway off the left side that leads back to a grand chapel that displays the nails of the cross, pieces of the True Cross, thorns from the Crown of Thorns, and so forth. How blessed we are to have this most important relic in our collection!

RED MASS

The Diocese of Birmingham in Alabama and the Catholic Lawyers of the St. Thomas More Society cordially invite all judges, lawyers, law students, legal related professionals and the public they serve to the annual Red Mass on Thursday, October 1, 2026 at 6:00pm at the Cathedral of St. Paul. The Red Mass is a Mass of the Holy Spirit celebrated annually at the opening of the judicial year to invoke divine guidance for all who seek and administer justice. This Thirteenth Century European custom received its name from the red color of the vestments worn by the celebrant and the scarlet robes worn by the Lord High Justices. The Red Mass came to the United States in 1877 and has been celebrated in Alabama since 1974. The celebrant will be The Most Reverend Steven J. Raica. MOMS & SMALLS

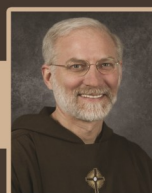
